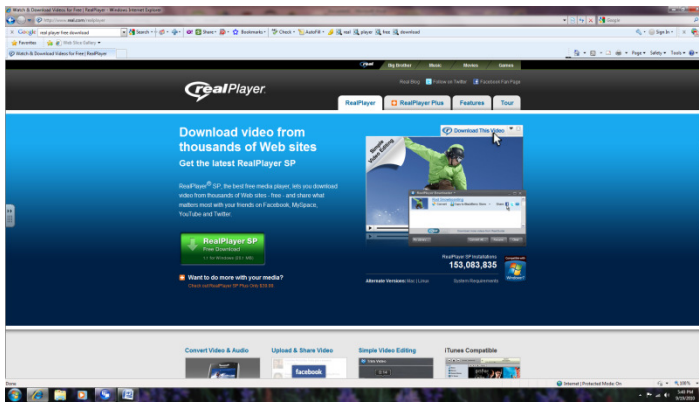


Downloading and Using RealPlayer Plus to Convert Internet Videos

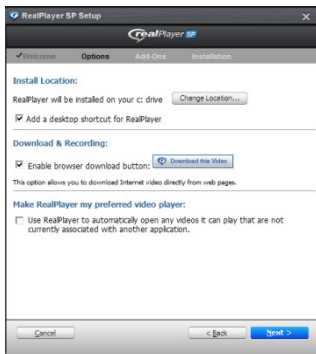
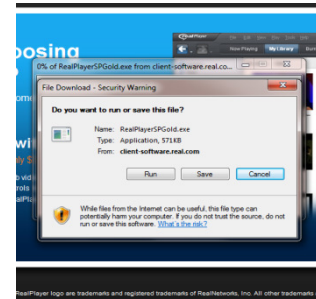
Go to www.real.com



Click on the green **RealPlayer SP** button to download the program.

Click on the **Run** button.

Follow the screen instructions to allow the install if blocked and accept the user agreement.



*Important: make sure that the **Enable browser download button**: is checked. (This button will automatically appear anytime you view an Internet video that is available for download).*

Click Next

If you are asked if you want to download another program **Click No or uncheck** the option to download the program.

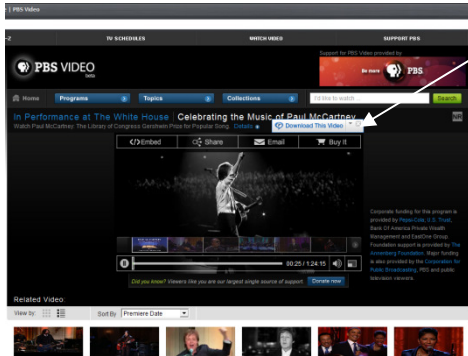
Click Next

To complete the installation you will be prompted that all Internet Browser windows need to be closed and is it okay for RealPlayer to do this for you. **Click on Ok.**

To Download a Video from the Internet

Simply go to the web video you would like to download. You can use any video on the internet that the owner allows you to download.

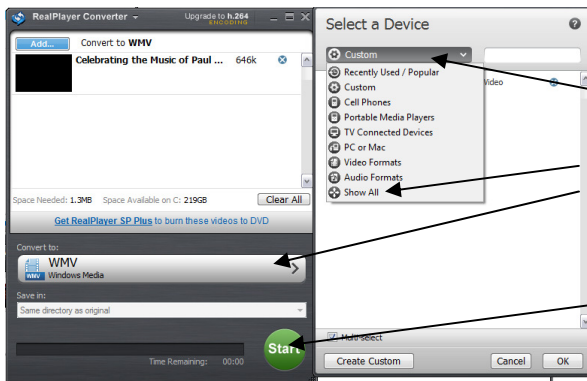
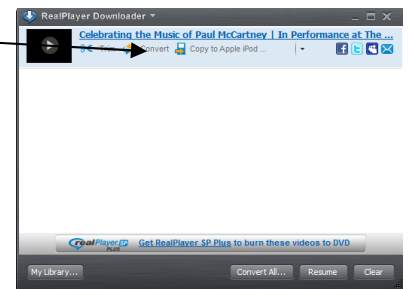
Start the video from the webpage. You will then see a **Download This Video** button in the upper right-hand corner of the video window, if it is available for download. (*Note: if you do not see the **Download This Video** button, then the video is not available for download*).



Click on the **Download This Video**

The video will begin to download and the RealPlayer SP download window will open.

To convert the video, hover over the name of the title of the video that is being downloaded and the menu will appear. **Click on the Convert button.**



To get the option to save to WMV **Click on the Convert** to option.

Then **Click on the Custom** drop-down menu. **Click on Show All** and **Click on WMV**. (*Note: This will give you the option to convert the video to WMV, so that you can use this video in a PowerPoint or play it on Windows Media Player*).

Click Start

Your video will now download to a WMV format file located in your **RealPlayer Downloads** folder. (*Note: Notice there will be two video files a .flv file and a .wmv file. You will want to use the .wmv file. This is the file that looks like the video, not the one with the r*).
